MEASLES CIRCULATING WIDELY GLOBALLY

The Measles Incident Management Team (IMT) now recommends that all infants aged 6-11 months should receive an MMR vaccine before travelling abroad (ideally at least 2 weeks before travel). As measles is circulating widely globally, this applies to all travel abroad. Note, a dose given at less than 12 months of age does not replace the dose recommended at 12 months of age.

CONTACTLESS PAYMENT OPTION



A pilot scheme for the use of tap n'go payments is being rolled out in the Derry diocese. Clonmany parish has been chosen as one (of four) parishes for this, and the only one in Donegal. This is in line with what has happened in other dioceses in Ireland.

The *tap n' go* machine will be placed in Saint Mary's church for a trial period.

Any use of it is of course voluntary, and will not overlap in any way with the normal practice of collections in our parish. It may be of use to some parishioners and visitors, or not at all.

Mass is Boring. or... maybe we're just not ready!

We were wondering last week: "Why should I go to Mass, It's boring" We looked at a few things, including seeing Mass as a thing to do (religion) instead of a life to live (faith).

Mass in Clonmany is exactly the same as it was at the first Mass, the Last Supper. It is still the Lord Jesus, giving himself for us, so that we may be loved eternally. But, if we're not ready for that, Mass will never make sense. Why?

Please leave now

This is Celbridge Parish church. We see it is based on a traditional design — with one main centre aisle and the two smaller side aisles. This design reflects a belief that was in our Christian faith centuries ago. And this belief had to do with who was ready to be present at the celebration of Mass.




At that time, "catechumens", meaning people who had not yet arrived at a mature faith, would sit only in the outside aisles, and they would stay only for the early parts of the Mass (the Readings).

After that they would leave in order to do more preparation on what it means to be part of a Christian Community.

In the meantime the doors were locked and those who remained, celebrated together that they were in *communion* with each other, in the Lord. In other words, that part of the Mass from the offertory onwards was reserved for committed believers. Everyone understood that this is a "high" and solemn prayer of the Church and it is not easy to feel part of it without some formation and some growth in faith.

So here's the thing: "Getting nothing out of it" (Mass) can sometimes be due to a lack at this level. We're just not ready!
