

The papers had a story recently about an unlucky punter who threw away a lotto ticket, only to find out later that it was worth €25,000. He began desperately searching everywhere he had been. Finally, remembering he last had it in a pub, he raced there - where staff told him they had thrown it in the bin two days earlier. So he "dived into the bins", only to be told the rubbish had already been collected and was on the way to landfill. Yet even then he still has hope, because he has reported it to the police in case it is handed in.

It seems too late did our punter realise the value of what he had, but discarded. And, perhaps like us looking for the priceless pearl Jesus speaks of, the lotto ticket was his 'pearl of great price'. It was his driving passion.

Jesus said that our life is like searching for fine pearls. If we find the one that is truly priceless, we sell everything to have it ... everything! (Matthew 13:45-46)

Of course, there is, literally, an eternity of difference between the punters ticket and the pearl Jesus talks about. This pearl is so valuable that we give away everything we are, we surrender our lives to it - not as a burden, but because we know now its value ... the numbers for eternal life.



Jesus of course is talking about the pearl that He is. He is talking about the Life He alone gives.

And either what He says is completely true ... or it is complete nonsense. We see that many who have been offered the pearl of eternal life in baptism have decided it is complete nonsense, and have (in effect) discarded it.

They are brave souls, and fortunate, because they have found 'real' life. Or, they are like the punter who had the lotto ticket, and too late realised its value!

Playing fast and loose with the offer of eternal life. That's what we call 'high-stakes' ... a real gamble!
