IS POPE FRANCIS EVEN A CATHOLIC

... OR IS HE, IN FACT, A HERETIC?

This is the question a number of 'social media' Catholics have been asking over the last week, especially on their YouTube channels. They're upset at what they see as the latest blunder by Pope Francis in terms of him defending (or even knowing) our Catholic Faith. It happened during the Holy Father's visit to Singapore when he had a meeting with young people from different faith backgrounds (including Sikh, Muslim, Hindu and Christian).

During the meeting Pope Francis said: "All religions are paths to God", and added "But my God is more important than yours!" Is this true? There is only one God, and religions are like languages, paths to reach God."

Our YouTube commentators are upset because this, they believe, is a denial of the core belief of our Catholic Faith — that, as *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) tells us, *There is no salvation apart from Christ and his One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church*, and how this is *an infallible teaching*, not up for debate among Catholics (at CCC 846).

However, the challenge for our YouTubers might be this: OK, they know this teaching about salvation, but they seem not to know (or disregard) what comes next in the Catechism. This next part speaks of "those, who, through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ or his Church" (CCC 847). Our Church teaches that, if people in this situation live their lives with a sincere heart, and in a loving and good and kind way, they may (without understanding) be seeking the GOD of Catholic Faith. And, if so, those too may achieve eternal salvation. (CCC 847)



But it does leave this question. What about those who *do know* the Gospel of Christ — those who are baptised, by their own choice? Perhaps salvation just happens automatically, or not? But it'd be worth knowing about anyway ... just in case someone actually does come 'to judge the living and the dead'!
