THE CHURCH IS DYING — WOOHOO!



Those who don't know us think the Church in Ireland is dying. And they'll point to the evidence.

Seminaries are closed, and many traditional practices are largely gone.

- The Church, which used to be central to everything in Ireland, is now at the margins, and seen as largely irrelevant.
- The numbers associating with the Catholic Faith, in a meaningful and honest way, have collapsed.
- The values being promoted by the secular country we now are (for example, around the dignity of life) are not, we believe, those of the Lord Jesus.

And so believers and unbelievers alike say "The Church in Ireland is dying." And they are right. The problem, for the unbelievers especially, is that they think 'dying' means 'gone' or 'finished', 'the end'. Absolute nonsense.

The end of the Church has been proclaimed many times. The first time was on a Friday afternoon about 2000 years ago, on a hill outside Jerusalem. They nailed Jesus to a tree and said 'That's the end of that'. It didn't happen then, and it will not happen now. In holy words we say the Church is the *Mystical Body of Christ*, and **Christ is Risen, never to die again.**

So, 'Is the Church dying?', is the wrong question. The right question is what kind of Church is the Holy Spirit calling us to be at this time, in Ireland, and (for us) in Clonmany? Because if we go about trying to be a Church based on what we want — perhaps through sentimentality or fear or comfort — and not on what the Holy Spirit is calling us to be, then that church will inevitably die, and stay dead — because there is no life there ... it is not of GOD.

On this Mission Sunday, let's take time to ask the only question that matters: What kind of Church is the Holy Spirit calling us to be?
