





THE CHRIST CHILD... THE LIGHT WHO CAME TO US On new year's eve 2019, we had Mass in my then parish at 11.30 at night, The idea was to give thanks to GOD for the year passed, and ask blessings on the year to come. As it turned out 2020 became a year like no other, and some thought we should ask for our money back!

By March lockdown came. Hardship and worry came, about livelihoods and family, and the future. Covid-19 had arrived, and 'normal' life was turned upside down. Then there was a 'second wave', and a third. With it came sickness and death. Numbers were broadcast on RTÉ every day ... each 'number' a loved father or mother, husband or wife, brother or sister — a darkness and heartbreak compounded (if possible) by the way funerals were restricted to only some. The call was 'keep your distance'.

We did a survey with our Confirmation candidates about their Covid-19 experience. They said things like:

- When we first went into lockdown I was happy because I could stay up late and sleep late. But I didn't realise I wouldn't see my friends or family for this long. I miss my grandparents most. I haven't hugged them since almost last year
- I for one was sacred because when me or my family got sick we would have got tested, and there's a scary feeling about it.

They also spoke about those on the 'frontline' — those who nursed us, cared for us, fed us, protected us.

At Christmas time the Confirmation children wanted to do something for their parish. They decided to send everyone in the parish a Christmas card, and had a competition to design a card. Some of the card chosen is shown here (her mother happened to be a health worker).

In the darkness of a terrible year, these children reminded us of the true Gift of Christmas ... using the very words we hear at Mass on Christmas morning — that the Christ Child is the Light that no darkness can overcome.

May each of us find this Light in ourselves, and our homes this Christmas.
