BAPTISM ... 'WHERE IT ALL BEGINS'

Shortly after being chosen as Pope in 1978, John Paul II visited his homeland in Poland, and the small home town of Wadowice, where he had been baptised. On that day:

Like all of us, at baptism, Karol Wojtyła received the PRICELESS GIFT. Like all of us, he had to choose what to do with the PRICELESS GIFT. Like all of us, the PRICELESS GIFT for baby Karol was the offer of Eternal Life (in holy words, the Gift of sanctifying grace). Like all of us, this was the offer to live as a follower of Jesus Christ.

By the time he had been chosen as Pope, Karol Wojtyła had lived an extraordinary life of love, and of faith, of joy and of wonderful witness to Jesus Christ.



Now, as Pope John Paul II, he returned to this small, rural church, kneeling humbly before an old stone baptismal font. At this font, on 20th June 1920, he received the PRICELESS GIFT of Baptism. And all those years later, in 1979, it was at this font where Pope John Paul (now Saint John Paul) then spoke these words:

"At this baptismal font I was accepted into the grace of God's sonship and faith of my Redeemer"

The caption underneath the font where Pope John Paul knelt told us everything:

'This is where it all began'.
