Reflecting on this understanding of Easter, a famous spiritual writer, William Bausch, leaves little to the imagination:

 Easter is not about bunnies and butterflies. Easter is about a Jesus who while alive was so radical that the prevailing culture killed him. He was a threat to the world as it was and is more of a threat now that he's footloose after the Resurrection. Bunnies and butterflies we can handle, but a risen Christ, just as radical as he ever was, is too much. Maybe that's why we settle for a spiritual Disneyland.

What we do know is that, for us as believers, Easter is the most joy-filled time of the year. It's a time filled with new life, made possible for us by the life and death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This same Jesus invites us to make the Easter journey in our lives, with Him. This is the journey from ...



Darkness to LIGHT Despair to HOPE Fear to COURAGE Sadness to JOY Turmoil to PEACE Death to LIFE

This is what the Easter Stories tell us. It is the testimony of those who first encountered the Risen Christ.

It is the testimony of countless others since. Every day of our life reminds us that it needs to be our testimony too. Indeed, if you're reading this, you are entitled for it to *be* your testimony, to *be* your experience.

Or, maybe it really is just about the Easter bunny?!
