

One of the words most associated with Pope Francis is 'humility'. Also, his powerful love for the poor and the powerless tell us how he saw his mission. It is fitting that his final message was the Easter papal message to the world (Urbi et Orbi). Fitting because this final message contained many of the themes close to his heart. He said:

- "God created us for life and wants the human family to rise again! In his eyes, every life is precious! The life of a child in the mother's womb, as well as the lives of the elderly and the sick, who in more and more countries are looked upon as people to be discarded."
- He then turned his attention to our troubled world with heartfelt pleas for peace in the Holy Land, in Sudan, in Ukraine.
- "Christ, my hope, has risen," Pope Francis then announced, calling on us to turn our gaze to the empty tomb.

Pope Francis has sought to inspire and challenge in equal measure. His vision for the future of the Church is 'synodal' - women and men, lay and clerical working closely together sharing power and responsibility. He has sown these seeds

Coming from a vibrant mission-driven Church in Latin America, Pope Francis sought to remind us of the central Christian truth that God loves each and every person and has a plan for their life.

When he was released from hospital a few weeks ago, the Pope's 'care plan' included two months of strict convalescence. The Holy Father had other plans - instead touring St Peter's Square in the Popemobile, greeting pilgrims. As a sick old man, he had complete trust in God and the belief that it is the world to come that matters more. That he died peacefully just hours after this - having celebrated the Resurrection - is providential.

May he rest now in peace, and rise in glory to that life eternal.
