When is second

Holy Communion?

It's reasonable question: Has the way we celebrate focused more on Christion faith or secular culture?

HOW TO TELL THE DIFFERENCE

An example of the difference between these two views (secular and Christian) was shown by the lady who went onto the Joe Duffy radio show. She was troubled because she had spent €1300 on a Communion dress for her daughter, but the dress didn't fit. And if that were not disaster enough, she then said, out of the most wonderfully secular understanding, "My daughter will never have her Communion again".



People might say 'But we know what the lady means'. Yes we do, but she is not saying it. We know she means that the pivotal cultural big day of "we have a communion" will not come again.

However, because she uses the word 'Communion' as if it is a product on a supermarket shelf (like washing powder), she utterly misinterprets what believers hold as sacred. The lady of

course did not mean to be disrespectful, but for Catholics of Faith that is what it is. Because the sacred Eucharist (the sacrament of Holy Communion) is the very Presence of GOD. It is the Presence of GOD the Son, Jesus Christ.

The lady is always welcome, with her daughter, at any celebration of Mass — and there she can encounter the same Risen Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, and so 'have her Holy Communion' again ... and again ... and again ... and again. The overwhelming cultural response to this may see it as small-minded fault-finding, or perhaps even grossly unaware of the reality. However, as disci-

ples of the Risen One, if we are serious at all about our message, surely we must ask:

Is a grotesquely expensive dress that doesn't fit really the reason for the cruelty and terrifying passion, the torture, and horrendous death of crucifixion that Jesus underwent? Is this really the reason he died ... for us?
