SHOULD WE FAST BEFORE HOLY COMMUNION?

S hould we fast before receiving Holy Communion? The answer to that is '**YES!**' Our Church still teaches this:

"A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine."

However, it will come as a surprise to many that our Church (still) teaches that, if possible, Catholics are supposed to fast before receiving Holy Communion. In generations gone by – when the rules for fasting were much more strict – everyone knew about this, and were faithful to it.

Why should we fast before receiving the Eucharist?

A woman went on a retreat hoping to find out more about GOD and about herself. She prayed, "Who are you, GOD ... and who am I?" For three days she prayed this, but felt there was no answer coming. As she was leaving the retreat grounds she tried one last time: "Who are you, GOD ... and who am I?" An answer came, a revelation:

"I am GOD and you are not!"

In that answer lies the meaning of Holy Communion.

Older generations will know that, compared to what the fast used to be, we have gotten soft. They will remember that the Eucharistic fast consisted of no food, no drink, and no water from Midnight until after Mass. Over the years this has been reduced, so that the requirement now is to fast for one hour before receiving Holy Communion (except for those who are sick and their caregivers).

Of course, to make fasting a 'requirement' means nothing – it should, only, be an act of love. For seeing it as an act of love means that we understand what Jesus has done for us — that He voluntarily died to save us ... and so we voluntarily take on a small penance (a minor inconvenience), by way of saying 'thank you'.
